



KNOW YOUR RIGHTS

GENERAL VOTING RIGHTS

- **Stay in line:** If polls close while you're still in line, you can still vote.
- **Ballot mistake?** Ask for a new one.
- **Machines down?** If the machines cannot be fixed quickly, ask for a paper ballot.

IF YOUR NAME IS NOT ON THE VOTER LIST

- Ask the poll worker to recheck, including spelling and supplemental lists, and to call the clerk to verify the complete list.
- Make sure you're at the right polling place.
- If your name is still not found and you've exhausted all other options, ask for a provisional ballot as a last resort. Before you leave, check with the poll worker or county clerk for instructions on how to ensure your ballot is counted, including any deadlines or additional information.

LANGUAGE HELP

- You can bring a family member, a friend, or a community advocate (not your employer or union representative) to help you.
- Some counties are required to provide bilingual poll workers and ballots. Ask for help in your language if available.

IF SOMEONE TRIES TO STOP YOU FROM VOTING

Examples of intimidation include:

- Aggressive questioning about citizenship, criminal record, or eligibility to vote.
- Following voters to, from, or within the polling place.
- Flaunting a firearm outside of a polling place or near a dropbox.
- Telling eligible voters that casting a ballot can have harmful consequences.

Examples of disinformation include:

- Pretending to be an election official.
- Sharing fake ads or flyers with misinformation about voting or at the polling place.
- Posting false information about voting rules.

Your Right: It is illegal to intimidate, threaten, or coerce voters. All voters are protected against intimidation, threats, or coercion at the polls.

IMMIGRATION & LAW ENFORCEMENT ENGAGEMENT AT THE POLLS

Voting is only for eligible U.S. citizens.

If law enforcement approaches you at or near the polls:

- Stay calm and keep your hands visible at all times.
- You have the right to remain silent or consult a lawyer before answering questions.
- You can decline consent to an immigration agent's request to search you. In some cases, they may still conduct a search without your consent.
- If stopped in a car, show your license, registration, and insurance if asked.
- Red Cards help assert legal rights but are not legal advice (consult a legal service).
